


Dick was a 30-year member of the Odd Fellows and held memberships in the Encampment, Canton and Rebekahs, in addition to the Odd Fellows.

The Assembly Journal has been out for a few months now. You should have had it in September at your first meeting (the typing was done in July), but several things held it up. How many of you subscribe to "Reminisce Magazine?" If you do you know they always have you searching for Hattie's Hat Pin. Well, I

think that is what happens with the Journal. To date six errors have been pointed out to me. Some were because things did not come out right when the page was re-arranged and some were misinformation. It is funny when you think how many times that book is reviewed. At any rate, any errors are entirely my fault, not the Printing Committee. Every new member should be handed a booklet of By-Laws along with a Charge Book. This way they will know what the rules and regulations are.

A correction on last month's column. If your Lodge consolidates with another Lodge before the end of the year, then your Lodge members will appear on the new Lodge rolls before the Annual Report. In that case, only one set of Per Capita or SGL dues would apply. Clear as mud?? If you need further explanation, give me a call. Sorry if I misled anyone on this issue. If you are planning on selling a hall owned by the Rebekahs, you must get permission from the Rebekah Assembly prior to selling.

A question has come up about Odd Fellows and Rebekahs going into the Home since it is open to all seniors. This is to assure you that Odd Fellows and Rebekahs have priority when applying for admittance to the Home or one of the apartments and will be put at the head of the list if there is not an immediate opening.

George and I send you merry Christmas and happy New Year greetings from our house to yours. May the Lord's blessings be on you this entire holiday season and throughout the New Year.

An update on guidelines for Washington OddFellow reporters

We have printed these guidelines for reporters in *The Washington OddFellow* newspaper several times. As a result, many of your stories are now easier to read and put into type for the newspaper. However, several of you may have overlooked these guidelines. If you can, please keep these guidelines by your typewriter, computer or writing desk for future reference.

Again, here are a few suggestions which will make *The Washington OddFellow* a better newspaper for all of us:

- Be sure to include the name and number of your Lodge and the name of your town if the Lodge name is different. As a reporter, please include your name, too, so we can give you credit.
- If your story is handwritten, leave plenty of space between lines and please print any names so I can get them spelled correctly. Please double check all names. We have spent many hours researching membership rosters to make sure questionable names are spelled correctly and we have corrected the spelling on dozens of names. However, I am sure there are many more misspelled names that have slipped through.
- If your story is typed, please double space and *do not* type your entire story in all capital letters and *do not* use both sides of the paper. Please use *plain white typing paper*, not the onion skin type.
- Please include the names and pertinent information about deceased members on a *separate* piece of paper for the Memoriam column. Information should include the persons name, how long they have been a member and what offices they have held
- Remember, *The Washington OddFellow* is received in your home and everyone else's on or about the first of the month. Keep this in mind when you are writing about events that will already have taken place by the time the newspaper is in your mailbox. Even if an event has not yet happened when you write your story, please word your story in the "past tense" if your event takes place before the newspaper comes out.
- Try to keep your stories as concise as possible. You have probably noticed that we have many more Lodges reporting now than we had in the past. Concise stories mean we can fit in news from more Lodges.
- Finally, when you are finished, read over your story to make sure everything is spelled correctly. Then, as a final measure, read the story out loud to yourself or to someone else. This is an easy way to tell if you have left out some important word or fact.
- Remember, our deadline is the 10th of each month for the next month's edition. The next deadline is December 10 for the January, 2005 edition. You may mail your stories or fax them to: (360) 829-5339. You may e-mail your stories to: billo@tx3.com
