



LEARNING FROM ADVERSITY

Adversity will bring out the best in some people and the worst in others. If we are lucky, we learn some positive lessons from it. If we refuse to learn from it, we generally wind up pretty miserable. By the time you read this we will have had a meeting with the Sovereign Grand Master, the IARA President, and the Executive Committee of the Grand Lodge and Rebekah Assembly of Washington. This meeting will have produced some resolution to the problems with the Rebekah Assembly management that needed to be addressed, and which they have refused to do at the time of this writing which is mid-January.

We will have certainly resolved the issue of selecting a replacement for Dee in a correct manner, and we should be on our way to resolving the other issues that have festered within the Order in the Jurisdiction of Washington for too many years.

You may find that the complexion and tone of the Rebekah Assembly has changed a bit as the result of this and hopefully that will lead to more harmony and a better working relationship between the Rebekah Assembly Executive and the Grand Lodge Executive Committees. I will tell you now that when we are done, if you want to review the facts and read the documentation to understand what really transpired you will be welcome to come to the Grand Lodge Office and review the reams and reams of letters and documentation that I have waded through to arrive at the decisions I have had to make on this issue from day one — both my letters and letters from all involved parties. That is the only way I see to dispel any and all rumors is for you as an individual Odd Fellow or Rebekah to know the truth of the situation.

Sometime ago I received an e-mail from an old friend of the Robinson family. This lady knew Dee from the time she was a little girl until

her passing away in October. In it she made reference to bitterness over the way Dee was treated by some of her so called "Sisters." I can assure you that there is no bitterness, not now and never has been. What you need to understand is that a good husband would not let someone wrong his wife or family in any manner and that is what some of these so called Sisters have done to Dee and my family by their actions and words.

This same lady suggested that we should institute a class of Odd Fellows and Rebekahs in Dee's name. I am sure she would like that. However, if you knew Dee as well as some of you claimed you knew her, then a class of Theta Rho Girls or the institution of a new Theta Rho Club would be a better thing to do in her memory. They were almost all young people that she helped or took an interest in as they passed through the kitchen to work for her or as we had them in our 4-H club or knew them from another club.

You see, Dee was all about helping children who needed someone to care about them. Many of these kids did not have very good home situations and she spent a considerably amount of her own time helping and counseling them as most of the kids she came in contact with knew she was someone they could talk to and trust. A great many of them from time to time would come up to us on the street or in a store and say, "You don't remember me, but I worked for you in the kitchen at Kennewick High School or some other school" or "I was in your 4-H club. Thank you for what you did for me." When asked what that was

Spokane LAPM #2 to install new officers on February 5





RAISING OUR PROFILE

Greetings, Patriarchs!

My goal for my year as Grand Patriarch is to have members of Encampments go to their lodges and raise the profile of their Encampments. In past months I've written about some strategies for



talking up Encampments, including speaking to members one-on-one and talking about Encampment activities during "Good of the Order" in lodge. Let's assume that you've talked to every member of your local lodge and you now have some Third Degree

Brothers who are ready to take the next step in Odd Fellowship. What now?

Giving interested members their first taste of Patriarchal Odd Fellowship is an excellent use of an open Encampment meeting. Pick a meeting night for your Encampment where you're going to do a fun activity. Invite members of your surrounding lodges. Hold an open meeting where you don't take up the password or give any signs. Show them everything that Encampments have to offer: have fun, discuss the symbolism and history of the Order, plan other fun activities, and enjoy fraternity and socializing. As so many of our Past Grand Patriarchs have said, we need to sell our Encampments to our members. There's a reason why each and every one of us made the step up to the Royal Purple Degree and we need to share that with our prospective new Patriarchs.

The thing that compelled me to want to take the Encampment degrees was the mentoring of the more senior members of my lodge. They set a striking example of the benefits of Patriarchal Odd Fellowship. They are a very intellectual lot and, as such, have a keen interest in the symbolism and meanings of our Order. After Lodge meetings, they would talk about the exciting things coming up in Encampment and I wanted to be a part of it. If that worked for a youngun' like myself, it's worth trying all around our Jurisdiction.
