# Mark Inman needs our help; make donations to Frontier!!

Past Grand Master Carson and Judy Inman's son Mark was in a serious accident on August 19, 2007. He was east of Port Gamble. It was raining and his pickup went off the road. He was not found for about seven hours. When found, he was laying in water and in the rain. They could not fly Mark out because of the bad weather, so he was taken to Bremerton for diagnoses before he was sent to Harbor View Medical Center in Seattle.

He had a bruised brain and lung. His hip and pelvis, right hand and left foot were broken, plus he suffered from severe hyperthermia. He spent nine days in ICU and the trauma care unit. After surgery on August 23, when two pins in the foot and four in the hip were installed, Mark is now in a wheelchair and will be for six to eight weeks.

The company he works for, Reijnen Construction, has set up an account for him at Frontier Bank of Washington to help with all the expenses as he had no insurance. He has bills to pay and could really use the help of our Brothers and Sisters. You can make donations at Frontier Bank branches in his name.

Carson and Judy are now taking care of him and his son at their home. They are taking his son to school every morning as he is a sophomore in high school. He started school on September 5 and they didn't want him to change schools. That is what we do for family.

# CAN CHRISTMAS BE JUST AROUND THE CORNER?

Dear Sisters and Brothers:

For you who have children or grandchildren planning on, (going to or in), college, I would remind you there is a deadline on applying for the L.J. Jones Scholarship. Forms can be requested from Grand Lodge.

I have had occasion over the past few years to pick up some Lodge Charters. This is sad for me and for the lodge

members who have worked so hard over the years. When a Charter is surrendered there are certain steps which have to be followed. For the current operating lodges, there are some items I would urge you to follow at all times:

- 1 Keep an accurate and up-to-date record of your members. This includes their current address and their dues payment record. I have found that when I receive the membership list, many of the listed members have passed away or are no longer members. This means the newspaper is being sent where it does not belong. This makes the paper costs go up and is reflected in your billing, plus you are paying per capita for people who are not paying dues. Notify the Grand Lodge Office when someone is dropped, passes away or moves. It also means these members cannot be accepted into State Lodge and must be dropped from the Order.
- 2 Keep your financial statements current. Observe the rules of the Order and, if surrendering your Charter, do not try to "get rid of your funds." When this is done it is your Sisters who suffer, not the Assembly, as they must further assume the burden of the expenses. Remember, the officers of the lodge are responsible to see that this is not done.
- 3 Hopefully this will not happen to you, but if it comes to the question of surrendering your Charter ask the Assembly Secretary for the paper work which must be done. Follow the directions carefully, especially as far as signatures and seal are concerned. This is very important.


