Our Noble Grand Norline has been very busy. She's a volunteer fireman besides having a full time job. Schools are closed, plus many people in the Doty-Dryad area lost their homes. We are all right. We will get through this.

I called the *Chronicle* editor and he would tell me the news. Now I have a generator for a few hours a day, so I can get some news from TV.

If any lodges need a charity to donate to, they could send a donation to Sylvan Glen for the Ambulance Fund. NG Norline, our volunteer fireman, says supplies are going down fast and will need to be replaced. They are doing a wonderful job and I know they are getting very little sleep.

Power west of Pe Ell could be out as much as three weeks. They haven't started working yet, so it might be longer.

TRUE COMMUNITY SUPPORT

Our Order, Odd Fellows and Rebekahs, has a long history of mutual and community support. While government and commercial programs have supplanted some of our earlier functions in times of crisis, these programs are often overwhelmed and private organizations like ours can step in to fill the void. The beginning of December, 2007 brought western Washington a severe winter storm. Warm temperatures added snow melt to rivers already swollen by heavy rains, while high winds created their usual chaos. This all caused extensive loss of power and flooding in parts of southwest Washington and the temporary closure of many roads, including Interstate-5. The impacts were felt all over the state, not just in those areas immediately affected. A number of Odd Fellow and Rebekah Lodges are in areas affected by the storm and while our lodge halls appear to be undamaged, some of our members have not been so lucky.


A number of our lodges and members have already stepped up to provide warm food, transportation and assistance to their neighbors in need. One of our charges is to "relieve the distressed." With a state and nationwide organization of independent units, we are well-suited to provide community support on a more individual basis. Local units can assess need in their community while Brothers and Sisters in unaffected areas can provide support.

If your local lodge has identified a need in your community beyond your ability to fill, please contact the Grand Lodge office. If you have supplies to donate, please contact the Grand Lodge office and we will share that information with the lodges in the affected areas. Monetary donations can be made to the Disaster Relief Fund at the Grand Lodge Office. Maybe your lodge is available for a work party. If it is, let us know. After Hurricane Katrina this jurisdiction gave generously as individuals, lodges and grand bodies. We now have needs in our own back yard. What can you and your Lodge do to help? Challenges are also opportunities. Let's rise together to meet this opportunity.

A New Year, A Fresh Start

Two years ago in this column we were reporting the results of Hurricane Relief donations which motivated contributions to the Order's Hunger and Disaster Fund. Following the donations made from this fund at that time, the balance in the Hunger and Disaster Fund has remained at \$1,500 ever since. This year we may wish to look to our own Jurisdiction "To relieve the distressed" in the western part of our state in the aftermath of all the high winds and flood damage. Please give this fund some consideration in this season and please see other related stories in this issue of *The Washington OddFellow*.

Membership

Please review your lodge's copy of the November-December, 2007 issue of the *IOOF News* and turn to page 21 and read the article by Wayne N. Reynolds, PSGM and the General Chairman of the Committee on Membership. While you have this issue in your hands, turn to page 23 and check the line for the Jurisdiction of Washington. We *only* have a total of 62 reported for this jurisdiction while last year at this time we had a total of 108. The brightest spot is the Theta Rho Girls' Clubs with eight new members reported, an increase of two for them over last year. Encampments, Patriarchs Militant, LEA and LAPM have yet to record a single member to this point. The overall count for all of the SGL community is up by 80 over same period last year. The Jurisdiction of Washington has slipped to about 11th place in all of the Sovereign Grand Lodge community. We have been much better than this in the past.

New members please — Report Um ~ Report Um ~ Report Um ALERT! ~ ALERT! ~ ALERT!

Protect your lodge's E.I.N., or also known as your Taxpayer Identification Number. During this past year lodges have been receiving notices of a new filing requirement for Organizations With Gross Receipts of \$25,000 or Less.

A new annual notice, Form 990-N, must be filed by most tax-exempt organizations with gross receipts of \$25,000 or less. Previously, our lodges in this group generally were not required to file annual reports separately to the IRS.

Form 990-N is to be filed electronically. The IRS calls the new form an E-Postcard because it is short, easy, and electronic. It asks for the organization's name, address, name and address of a principal officer, and confirmation that the organization's gross annual receipts are normally \$25,000 or less.

The notice your lodge received from the IRS probably stated that: The annual electronic notice is due by the 15th day of the fifth month after the close of your tax period. For example, if your tax period ends on December 31, 2007, the annual electronic notice is due May 15, 2008.

The IRS, through its E-Postcard initiative, is developing a filing system for the annual electronic notice and will be publicizing filling procedures upon completion of the filing system.

As we are preparing this column for the January, 2008 issue, this office has not seen or heard of the particulars on how this E-Postcard system works. As soon as the details come out we will send a reminder letter with the additional information to all of our lodges. In the meantime, to those lodges that do not have access to the internet, the Grand Lodge office will be ready to assist you when we learn how this new filing is to be accomplished.

We hope all of you experienced a joyous holiday season. As we enter the month of January and the installation of officers, we have an opportunity for a fresh start. Let's get behind our new officers with our support and make them successful, as well as our Lodges.


