

I will be able to release the toll-free telephone number next month. I have to wait 60 days before it can be printed in any publication. I will be updating the web site when there are any changes.



Well this has been a very busy month. Between school and Theta Rho, I've barely had time to breathe — but that's just the way I like things. . . busy, busy!


