It is April 26, 2010 — 191 years since our fraternal brotherhood was instituted. As we celebrate this historical anniversary of a momentous occasion, our minds and hearts stand challenged to pause for at least a moment — "Be still — and think — and then rejoice."

We celebrate this 191st anniversary of the date when Thomas Wildey, John Cheatham, John Welch, John Duncan and Richard Rushmore brought into being the first Odd Fellow lodge on the North American continent by placing first things first and giving thanks that a humble man thought the ideals of our brotherhood important and valuable enough to bring this to his adopted home land.

Thomas Wildey was a fascinating man with a keen mind, possessing a sense of humor and love for others, making possible our great fraternal — Order, the Independent Order of Odd Fellows. Every man and woman who lives by the ideals and principles of the Three Links has reason to rejoice that Thomas Wildey lived — not only that he lived, but that Odd Fellowship was so much a part of his life that he was not satisfied until he had found kindred believers to join with him in practicing these fraternal beliefs.

Since that beginning on April 26, 1819, there have been hundreds of lodges instituted and countless thousands of members initiated.

Today, if Odd Fellowship, representing the IOOF, was called before the judge to be tried for its existence, whether it should live or die, many thousands of witnesses could I testify:

It helped me when I was in distress; stood by me when I was sick; came to my aid when misfortune overtook me; helped me up and encouraged me when I was discouraged; was at my side when father, mother, wife or husband died; comforted me in my grief; wiped away my tears; buried the dead; provided me with the necessities of life; cared for my orphaned children by giving them a home; and when my hands could no longer support me, gave me a home to rest in peace.


Our District Officers have started making their visits to the different lodges in our District. They will finish them up in June. I think it does us all good to visit with members of our other lodges.
