L. J. Jones winners announced; judges said job was challenging

Flash Hodges, a senior at Rosalia High School, has won the \$8,000 Odd Fellow Rebekah L. J. Jones scholarship for 2011. Flash joined his father Brad at Rosalia Odd Fellows #110 last year. A member of National Honor Society, Flash also has attained the rank of Eagle Scout, has been involved with 4-H, FFA, band, Future Business Leaders of America, plus baseball, football and basketball. He plans to major in agricultural communications at Washington State University this Fall.

The alternate for the \$8,000 scholarship is Carley-Rae Scholter, a senior at Auburn High School, who will major in chemistry and criminal justice at Saint Martin's University in Lacey. She did win a \$2,500 scholarship from Washington Odd Fellows/Rebekahs. She serves as Left Supporter to the Noble Grand at Unity Rebekah Lodge #53. The sixth generation member said that when her grandmother's grandmother was diagnosed with cancer, the local Rebekahs brought a "one-a-day-basket" every month. She reflected, "That kindness continues to touch our family's hearts and strengthen our character." Carley-Rae has devoted more than 900 hours to community service during high school.

Hope Klicker of Walla Walla also was awarded a \$2,500 scholarship. Hope is the granddaughter of Nancy and Robert Klicker who are members of Narcissa Rebekah Lodge #2 and Enterprise Odd Fellow Lodge #2, respectively. While attending Walla Walla High School, the graduating senior has taken advanced placement courses and will receive her Associates Degree from Walla Walla Community College through the Running Start Program. Hope has been active in Honor Society, Key Club, basketball, softball and choral ensembles. She will study elementary education at the College of Charleston in South Carolina.

Recipients of the \$2,500 scholarships for boys are Dylan Axtell and Kyle Elias Marlantes. Dylan is a senior at Prairie High School in Vancouver. He has been active in football, basketball and baseball while putting academics as a priority as a four-year honor roll member. He was a Boy Scout for eight years and currently is the den's co-leader. The saxophone player volunteers at his church and a local senior center where he is highly respected for his kindness and compassion. His plans are to study civil engineering at Oregon Institute of Technology. Grandfather Bud Axtell is a member of Vancouver Odd Fellows Lodge #3.

Kyle will graduate from Centralia High School where he was in honor courses for math English and science. School activities include Future Business Leaders of America and Science Club. He plans to study mechanical engineering at Saint Martin's College in Lacey. He indicates a strong work ethic accompanied by friendship and encouragement are at the top of his priorities in doing a job well done. Kyle is the grandson of Joyce Crowder, a member of Lorraine Rebekah Lodge #289 in Des Moines.

Lena Swetz, Vice President of the Rebekah Assembly of Washington, organized judging of the 2011 scholarships. Judges included Kurt Hummel, Key Bank Investment Services; Tom Manke, Superintendent of Morton School District; and Bridget Piper-Doran, K-12 counselor at Morton Schools. The team reviewed 13 completed applications from 12 lodges and noted that it was a challenge to select just five.

June is the month all Units of our Order meet in Yakima





This order was issued By Brigadier General Dan Mathews of the Pacific Northwest Council of the Patriarch Militant of the Independent Order of Odd Fellows.

The purpose of the gathering was to muster five new recruits into the Patriarch Militant Order. Captain Brian Brewer, Commanding Officer of Canton #20, called the Canton to order and the assemblage formed to bring the recruits into this order. The new recruits were Patriarch Joe Picanco, Patriarch Jennifer Snyder, Patriarch Laurel Delony, and Patriarch Walt Russell, all of Alpha Encampment #1 in Olympia.
