



Since November is the month that you should be having your elections of officers, I have taken my "Did You Know" from the Code of General Laws, The Grand Lodge of Washington, Independent Order Of Odd Fellows, Page 44 Section 3.10 OFFICERS, 3.10.5 Qualifications for **Noble Grand or Vice Grand by Service.**

• No member shall be installed as Noble Grand, unless they have served a term as Vice Grand, or the last of a term to fill a vacancy; nor as Vice Grand, unless they have served two terms in either elective or appointive offices of the Lodge, other than Trustee, provided that any Scarlet Degree member may be eligible, if all qualified members refuse to serve, and a dis**pensation be granted by the Grand Master** previous to the installation.

I highlight that last little section so that you understand that a District Deputy Grand Master cannot issue the dispensation. It must be the Grand

For those lodges with Invested Funds from Sale of Building, report this on Line 40. Do not include this amount on Line 39. Remember to use your Lodge Seal on those forms that require it and sign as required.

For reporting requirements and deadlines, refer to the Washington Digest, Chapter 3, Section 3.20.1, Section 3.20.2, Section 3.20.3 and Section 3.20.4 found on page 56. If there is anything confusing or you are in doubt as to how to complete your forms, please call the Grand Lodge office at 1-800-345-1766 for assistance.


Our Halloween party took place on Thursday, October 25. Costumes were worn and judged. Refreshments, including veggies and homemade stew, were served following the meeting.


