A MOMENT TO PAUSE AND REFLECT

I wish to start this letter by reflecting upon the month of September. First I would like to thank the Brothers and

Next I wish to share with you the scripture which was chosen to be part of my program for this term. It is Ephesians 6:12 which in the 1599 Geneva version reads: "For we wrestle not against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against

powers, and against the worldly governors, the princes of the darkness of this world, against spiritual wickedness, which are in the high places."

reside within municipalities, and labor for institutions or organizations of industry, that there are fundamental principles that are not contained within these. This is the concept of "light" vs. "dark"; or "good" vs. "evil", many social constructs follow this pattern and it can be scaled up to the size of nations, or reduced down to our own one on one interactions with another person.

When we overlook the basic principles of what moderates our behavior towards others, we begin to progress towards a place where we do not allow ourselves to "see" the good within us, and sometimes not "see" the good in others. This is often the time when relativism, or moral equivalence, start to seep into thoughts and deeds. A person will begin to turn inward towards themselves and challenges start to overtake and consume them.

Within our lodges, there are times when we struggle to put forth our Best Work, and often times it is easier to just throw it all in and walk away. Each person does have a limit as to what they will withstand before compromising their own principles. It is in working through our difficulties, and challenges that we find our resilience and the ability to move on to better things. This builds up our lodge's core and capacity for good works, and continuing to attract new members to be part of our experiences.




