# Washington OddFellow reaps 6 awards at SGL

The Washington OddFellow newspaper was the recipient of six awards bestowed by the International Press Association at the Sovereign Grand Lodge Sessions held in St. Louis, Missouri in August. Five of the six awards were first place certificates and one was a third place award. Competing in the monthly in-house printing classification, Washington's newspaper won the following:

- Best Overall Publication
- Layout & Design First Place
- Best Use of Photography First Place
- Best News Content First Place
- Best Jurisdictional Leadership First Place
- Best Column Third Place

"The Washington OddFellow has won many awards over the 21 years I have been editor" said Bill Ostlund. "But we have never been recognized to this extent in the past," he added. "It is because of the great letters from our officers and submissions from the many Lodge Reporters that made these awards possible," Bill continued.

The third place award for columns was a membership article submitted by Wardens Toby Hanson and Jenny Reed entitled "Now is the time to plant gardens & bring new members to our Order!!" It appeared in the May, 2017 edition of *The Washington OddFellow*.

"Large photos pop off the page! Interesting groups of photos."


"Interesting (news) coverage, thoroughly done." (Washington is an) "Active Jurisdiction. Nice to see the faces and activities along with good coverage!"



#### St. Louis Meeting



Ruth members are jumping right into the holidays by organizing their Christmas stockings for the Union Gospel Mission, as well as other items they may need.


Ruth will also be attending District Association #3 on Saturday, October 21.
