
Olympia Seafood Fest on Saturday, July 21!!

From the desk of the Assembly President


APRIL SHOWERS BRING MAY FLOWERS

The tours will be reinstated in 2019. I have sent verification forms. Be sure they are signed by the officers indicated and your Lodge Seal is attached and returned to my office as soon as possible. This does not have to be read in your lodge meeting before it can be signed and returned to me so your lodge name and number are checked off my list before the deadline. GREETINGS FELLOW PATRIARCHS!

I would like to thank the Patriarchs of the Grand Encampment for the opportunity to serve as your Grand Patriarch. While looking back on the many years of service to this Branch of Odd Fellowship, it has been a

challenged time as we have seen numerous changes to our Order in recent years as a reactionary measure to external forces that have been courted to operate not with our best interests in intent.

I wish to thank those of you who have welcomed me within your respective Encampments as I made my visits and travelled around the Jurisdiction. I also wish to thank the kindness that has been shown to my working partner, Grand Matriarch, Marcia Presley, as we have been raising donations for the

Sunny Sky's Animal Shelter.

This past year at Sovereign Grand Lodge a resolution has been presented to allow Scarlet Degree Odd Fellows to be eligible to join the Patriarch's Militant branch of our Order without previously belonging to an Encampment. The general direction and operational intent of our Order now appears to be to consolidate the Branches down into just one. What that future state may look like still remains to be determined. However as of this writing the Encampment is challenged in that our largest Jurisdiction is located in Pennsylvania.

Originally, when the Encampment Branch was created it served a useful function when lodges were vastly located all around a Jurisdiction. These lodges in each of the significant collective population centers were probably located about 15 to 20 miles apart or roughly a one day trip by the Wells Fargo Coach lines. Without modern means of communications, you had to rely on letters in the Post Office, or actually travelling to meet in person at lodge halls. When our membership nationally was in excess of one million, there existed limited opportunities for a member to achieve leadership and thus, "raise and elevate their character."

There was room and capacity for the Encampments to serve this unfulfilled need for leadership to travel around locally to area lodges and support degree work, and further study. Local Odd Fellow lodges with their degree work was written to speak directly to the individual member's internal qualities as a singular contributor to a new community of like minded people. The Encampment Degrees then focused on the purpose of a person as an outward mission of purpose within the world and further striving for diligence in their

endeavors.

Today with internet and social media, have been unravelling the fabric of the Order Jurisdictions have become a nebulous matter, as anyone can go shop around and find support for their ideas. Information without context becomes the new currency of the day and while much faster than past methods, leads to many more challenges with having to gauge effectiveness of messages in a vacuum. The things that have been reliable in the past to instill a fundamental expectation are no longer reliable in the modern world of little guidance and free-spirited manners.

In the end, it is my hope that eventually our Order will come to rest in a state of being where by we can allow younger members to enjoy some of camaraderie and mission of purpose greater than themselves. Our world today needs the value that non-profits and fraternal orders bring to bear to help support those in our society who have been, or ever felt, marginalized.


from Inez Lodge to Alder Lodge on May 11, 1955. She passed away on February 15, 2018. Leona will be greatly missed.
