# PGM Curtis Eliason passes in Richland

Curtis L. Eliason, Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Washington in 1990-1991, passed away December 24 at Kadlec Regional Medical Center in Richland. Brother Curtis was 79. He was born in Hagerman, Idaho and lived in Richland since 1963.

Brother Curtis was a Past Grand of Richland IOOF Lodge #338 and was current Treasurer. He was initiated into the Order on March 27, 1979 and received the First, Second and Third Degrees within the following month.

He retired from the Richland Fire Department and the Washington State Patrol. He was a firefighter at Hanford for a bit and was a State Patrol inspector for bus hatches.

No information was available regarding services for Brother Curtis. The Neptune Society of Spokane is in charge of arrangements.

# From the desk of your Grand Master

#### HAPPY NEW YEAR!

January is an excellent time to gain some perspective and look both forward and back, as it's the beginning of a

new year. January takes its name from the Roman god Janus, the god of beginnings, transitions, doorways, and passages. With that in mind, I want to look both back and forward in this column.

I love history; especially the sense of context it gives to the contemporary world. I think this is especially helpful for Odd Fellowship. During my years as a Theta Rho dad, I used to hang out at the South Tacoma Lodge hall while the Spunky Bluebirds held their meetings and read old proceedings of the Grand Lodge. I remember reading the Grand Master's address from 1927 where he cautioned the members that if we didn't

improve the membership situation soon, our Jurisdiction would drop below 300 lodges!

Looking at writings from a more recent Grand Master, in 1993, Fred Enge wrote, "We cannot change our past. . . we cannot change the inevitable. The only thing we can do is play on the one string we have, and that is our attitude." PGM Enge was definitely right about the role attitude plays in our perceptions. It's easy to be sad about the decline of our Jurisdiction from its peak at more than 300 lodges. However, it's also very heartening to see the ways in which Odd Fellowship is growing and rejuvenating.

#### 15 YEARS OF HISTORY AT OUR FINGERTIPS

For more recent history, *The Washington OddFellow* now has a 15-year archive of newspapers on our website that we can review. In June, 2018, PGM Kelly Hughes had some wise words for the future: "We need to work together with other lodges. Odd Fellows and Rebekahs need to work together. Start doing joint projects in the community."

Further evidence of the importance of that comes from PGM Laurel Delony in January 2013: "I would like to thank all of those Odd Fellows, Rebekahs and Theta Rho Girls who participated in the Jingle Bell Run/Walk to find a cure for Arthritis. We had our banner and the Independent Order of Odd Fellows was announced over the microphone. Never was I more proud!"

In 2007, PGM John Crispin noted: "Our communities are filled with unclaimed members, individuals whose ideals and values match our own, who are Odd Fellows and Rebekahs in spirit, but not yet name. They need to know that they can join us as we strive 'to improve and elevate the character of mankind." The recurring theme in all their comments is that, to ensure our future, we have to make the connections with the community to bring new members into our lodges.

#### LOOKING AHEAD

I have a suggestion for everyone: let's bring back the finest parts of our past. The new members I've met and talked with recently are interested in Odd Fellowship not because of modernity or expedience — there's enough in life that has become streamlined and easy — but because of what Odd Fellowship was in the past. That includes our traditional and historic regalia and customs. Things that seem antiquated in a fast-paced modern society, like officers' collars or the Sign of Recognition, are some of the things that are cool and unique and set us apart from joining a luncheon club or community center.

We have a rich, ornate, splendid history. I'd love to see more of it come back in common usage and I know many of our newest members would like that as well. I loved PGM Kelly's idea to wear historical collars at last year's Grand Lodge Session. I would love to do more of that and bring back the glory of Odd Fellowship. What strengthened us in our past very well could be part of the salvation of our future.

in the Sovereign Grand Lodge Roster and updated the Grand Lodge members spreadsheet, then your spreadsheet that I included in those packets should reflect your update. If you did not get the requested information in by the 9th, then your spreadsheet of members will not have the update.

Please make sure that your Secretaries are working on these reports and that they are sent back and into this office before February 15,

me at the Grand Lodge office, 800-345-1766. I will be happy to help you get your forms filled out. Make sure that the ending balance in your treasury is clearly marked as this is the starting number for the following year-end report. Be sure to seal and sign the report. These year-end reports are a lot of work, so I thank you Secretaries for all your hard work.

I am mailing out early the Representative and Alternate Representative Certificates. Per the code, if your lodge is odd numbered you are to elect a two-year Representative and an Alternate.

I am also sending this to even-numbered lodges, as well, as you might have had a resignation or some other unforeseen issue and may need to elect a replacement.

Please be sure to read the letter and elect your Representative and Alternate at the first meeting in February. Please be sure to get the certificates mailed into the office as soon as possible.

Make sure your lodge has voice and vote by making sure your Representative can attend Grand Lodge Sessions. Check out the "Did You Know" section below for more information.

# Here's how you elect your Grand Lodge Representative

#### **ARTICLE IV - REPRESENTATIVES SECTION 1.0**

The representation to this Grand Lodge shall be one Representative for each Lodge, and each Representative shall be entitled to one vote.

#### **SECTION 2.0**

Each Odd Fellow Lodge shall, at its first meeting in February (1999), as herein provided, elect by ballot from among its qualified Past Grands, a Representative to serve two years from the first day of the succeeding session; the odd numbered Lodges to so elect in the odd numbered years, and the even numbered Lodges to so elect in the even numbered years. Provided, that the even numbered Lodges shall elect for one year at the election in 1907. A majority of all votes cast shall be necessary for a choice.

#### **SECTION 3.0**

Each Representative of an Odd Fellow Lodge shall, at the time of their election, be furnished with a certificate in the form provided by the Grand Secretary. A duplicate of such certificate must be forwarded immediately to the Grand Secretary.

#### **SECTION 4.0**

When a vacancy occurs in the Representation of a Lodge from any cause, the Lodge may, in its discretion, fill the same. The election for filling a vacancy shall be conducted in the same manner as for the regular election of Representatives.

#### **CHAPTER 3**

CONSTITUTION FOR THE GOVERNMENT OF ODD FELLOW LODGES Independent Order of Odd Fellows Of Washington

#### 3.11.7 - Election of Representative

On the first regular meeting in February, the Lodge shall elect by ballot from among the qualified Past Grands, a Representative and Alternate Representative to the Grand Lodge as provided in Article IV, Sec. 2.0, found on page 8 of the Grand Lodge Constitution.


