

HOLY HOUSE PROJECT

For 13 years Washougal Odd Fellows Lodge #194 and the General Federation of Women's Clubs (GFWC) Camas Washougal have partnered together to support projects with Skamania County Council on Domestic Violence. The Odd Fellows financially support the project while GFWC does the leg work. It is a great partnership.

In April, which was Child Abuse Prevention Month, we worked together to support an ongoing project at Holly House, the shelter in Stevenson. Two "move out kits" were assembled. These are two totes each of household items for a domestic violence survivor to set up a basic household as they step away. It contains a set of dishes, silverware, glasses, pot and pans, towels, sheets, kitchen towels, pot holders and other miscellaneous items.

Twelve welcome bags are given to shelter residents when they first arrive. These contain full-size bottle of shampoo, hand cream, body wash, hand sanitizer, a bar of soap, toothpaste, tooth brushes, comb, hair brush, pen,



From your Grand Warden

Making our Order a vital key in our community

Greetings Brothers and Sisters,

As I write this I realize that when you get this it will only be a handful of days before we convene our Grand Lodge Sessions in Yakima. It will be a great time to see one and all again and renew those bonds of friendship

we may have missed over this past year. It will also be the time to bring together all our ideas and experiences that we had this past year in promoting our Order. However small or great all of those ideas and actions we participated in will have some affect on our Order. So we need to talk about them and learn from them.

We have books and journals that guide all of us in our actions within the lodges. Some of these are our Charge Books, our Washington

Digest, and our Sovereign Grand Lodge Code book. We all need to read and study these books as they teach us the right way to run a lodge meeting, a committee meeting and a session. And if we follow these guidelines and rules, our meetings and sessions will run smoothly, effortlessly, and be much more rewarding. For we will not only work better as a team of volunteers, but we will see how easy it is to be efficient and productive.

A GUIDE TO BEING AN ODD FELLOW

But what we don't have is a guide on how to be an Odd Fellow. We learn from others or for ourselves what it means to work together as volunteers. All of us have different ideas or reasons for joining this wonderful Order. Whatever those may be, are you promoting who and what you are? It is about telling and showing those around you how they too can become involved and help in the work you do. It is marching in your local community parades, participating in those flea markets, and bake sales, holding Bingo, Bridge, or Pinochle, fundraisers? Or is it hosting a recognition night for that special Eagle Scout or Girl Scout, honoring the firemen, policemen, hospital staff, or teacher? Is it serving a pancake breakfast, hot dog lunch, spaghetti dinner, or just opening your lodge monthly to serve cookies or donuts and coffee?

Mostly it is about showing up and being out in the public, letting everyone know you are there!

PLAN AND PROMOTE

So plan those events. Be sure to ask your fellow lodges to help in your participation. Ask the Grand Lodge to help out. Bring your family and get them involved. Advertise with flyers, in the newspaper, and especially in your Odd Fellow newspaper. Use social media to let everyone know what you are doing. And most importantly let everyone know what you did and how much they missed out by not being there. Show the work you are doing afterwards and tell all when your next event will be. Don't just do something one time and then stop, but plan out many things to participate in. Remember to constantly let people know what is coming up so they won't forget. And talk, talk and talk about what you are doing.

BE PROUD

Be sure to have items to show about your lodge and its history. Proudly wear and display our Odd Fellow Order with hats, shirts, banners, regalia — whatever you have that can be seen.

I had two members of my lodge ask me why we never report or talk about the events that we attend. For example, many of us know about our Northwest Meetings held in the spring and fall. Where the Jurisdictions of British Columbia, Idaho, Washington, and Oregon get together to discuss our Order. But do we come back and talk to our lodge and members about those meetings? We did this time, but it took a question from a member who has never gone to ask what we were doing.

LET'S TALK ABOUT OURSELVES

So remember talk about the things you do at your lodge meetings and to anyone willing to listen. Promote the idea of attending those other meetings and gettogethers outside of lodge. Help those who need to attend or ask if you need assistance to attend.

It's Been An Honor Serving AS YOUR WARDEN

Lastly let me say it has been an honor getting to serve you as your Grand Warden. To help out wherever possible at initiations and installations is quite an honor and always fun. 



THE SGL CODE OF GENERAL LAWS CHAPTER IV

GRAND LODGES

INDEPENDENT ORDER OF ODD FELLOWS **UNDER JURISDICTION OF** THE SOVEREIGN GRAND LODGE, I.O.O.F.

Section 5 — Members

The Officers and members of the Grand Lodge shall be all Past Grands and Past Noble Grands who have attained the Third Degree of an active Lodge who have received the Grand Lodge Degree. The Grand Lodge shall specify in its By-laws who shall have the right to

submit legislation, make motions, debate and vote.

Section 7 — Officers A — ELECTIVE OFFICERS

(1) The elective officers of the Grand Lodge shall be those specified in the Grand Lodge Ritual; selected from the Past Grands of regularly chartered lodges; Grand Master, Deputy Grand Master, Grand Warden, Grand Secretary, Grand Treasurer, and Grand Representative(s) or Alternate Grand Representatives(s).

E. — QUALIFICATION FOR OFFICE

(1) A Past Grand in good standing in an Odd Fellows Lodge and a member of a Rebekah Lodge, and in possession of the Grand Lodge Degree, is eligible to hold any office.

You can find out more information in the Sovereign Grand Lodge Code of General Laws.


WE'RE STILL BUSY


