Raychel's family would like to also thank everyone


for coming out and playing.

OBSERVATIONS FROM MY EXPERIENCES

In a recent visit to the Grand Lodge office, I had a conversation with the Grand Secretary about a number of things. One of them was a paper I had written some time ago when I had been a member of the Order for a few years. She asked me for a copy of it, which she received and I thought I would share it here with you.

These thoughts came to me after attending many Odd

Fellow functions with Dee and observing various members and how they acted towards one another. That is probably why it took her 15 years to convince me to join the Order.

I have shared this paper with several people over the years and some of them have tried to pass it off as their own thoughts. I can assure you it all came from me and was a thought that came to me after something was observed or a reaction to something that was said.


