

We hope all of you are staying safe. We are hoping to get back to our activities soon.





What's happening elsewhere across the US

The following information has been gleaned from various jurisdictional publications received by the Grand Lodge of Washington.

• California — The California Odd Fellow and Rebekah Publication reports in its July, August and September edition: "Sheltering In Place, San Francisco — The COVID-19 crisis has taken away so many things — lives, people's livelihoods, and daily life as most of knew it. We have learned what we always knew — family and friends are

important and just because we could not be together, we could still find ways to forge those bonds."

• Illinois —
Niles Reamer,
Grand Master,
wrote in the June
edition of The
Illinois Odd Fellow: "In
my 76 years, this is a very
trying year. My lodge meetings

have been canceled, (along with) church services and all other meetings. Assembly President Nann Johnson, wrote: "It is with a very heavy heart that I made the decision to cancel all of the Rebekah Spring District Meetings due to the COVID-19 virus. I have thought long and hard and feel it is the right decision for all of us at this time."

- Texas Grand Master Dan Reynolds wrote in the July edition of the Odd Fellow News of Texas: "I am planning to try and visit as many lodges as I can, however with all the restrictions so far this year, I will only have about 2-1/2 months to accomplish all my visits." Deputy Grand Master John "Fletch" Woolsey wrote: "Some of our lodges are starting to have meetings, while others are still meeting by Zoom or phone conferences. Please decide before you resume in-person meetings. It looks like it still be a while before we're past this crisis."
