she took me under her wing and became my mentor and friend.

Marcia was first elected Rebekah Assembly Secretary in 2009. She worked very closely with Judy Diekman, Assembly Treasurer. Together they implemented computer programs that act as the checks and balances of the accounts they work with for the Assembly.

Over the years Marcia has received numerous inquiries asking for help locating someone's deceased relative who was known to be a Rebekah or might have been one. She accepted all challenges with a caring attitude and love of our Order. She spent many hours on these projects and did not give up until that Rebekah was located or until she had no more places to check.

Marcia is a wealth of information. If I, or anyone, calls looking for an answer to any question, she will research it and either have the answer or return the call with not only the answer, but where to find the answer. She had her office open every day and many hours into the night.

Sister Marcia knows that the words shared by Sister Jennie are also shared by others who have had the opportunity serve with you in your Rebekah Lodge and in Assembly.

Prior to being secretary, Marcia served as President in 2007-2008. She has been a Rebekah for 55 years and is a third generation member. Her daughter Kim was initiated into her lodge in 2018 and is a fourth generation member. Marcia was a member of the Rainbow Rebekah Lodge #31 in Orting until it merged with Eola #63.in 2013.

Marcia is known for her hugs, knowledge and caring about others. Marcia will continue to have a part in Assembly work as she will be the Rebekah Assembly Historian and will keep the Journals and Annual Reports that are more than 10 years old.


New arrangements of our Odes ready!

Knowing the state of our membership and seeing that we were unable to raise a quorum, the Grand Lodge Officers decided to close our lodge and collect our Charter and the books. Sister Genie asked them if the Grand Lodge had voted to suspend the Charter (they hadn't) and noted that there was not a quorum present to surrender the Charter. This prevented the immediate closure and the officers encouraged Jean and Jim to get the lodge active again before the Grand

Lodge would be required to close it.

Jim and Jean recruited me (I was running a small nursery across the street). Jean visited all the other lodges in our district, Ballard-Alki, Renton, Auburn and Titusville. He offered to join those lodges as an Associate if one of their members became an Associate

in Des Moines. Jean became an Associate in Auburn and Renton and all four lodges had members join Des Moines. From my first meeting, we rarely missed quorum and I could count on seeing Jean and Jim and Tony Tamburello (Of Auburn) and Harold Macklin (Of Renton), as well as regular visits of Brothers and soon Sisters from Titusville and Ballard-Alki and additional members from Auburn and Renton.

Des Moines #305 would not be what it is today or even exist without their dedication and support.

Regardless of the challenge, Jean and Genie were always willing to help and drive the extra mile for our lodge and any other in need of assistance. Their generosity and willingness to embrace others is something that I will always remember and cherish.

HERE IS THE ANSWER

Any component of the Independent Order of Odd Fellows *MUST* have a minimum of two authorized signatures on a check.

If you are wondering where it states this, you will find it in the Sovereign Grand Lodge Code of General Laws Chapter XXIV, Funds, Fees, Dues, Assessments, Benefits, Section 2., D. I have copied the following directly from the Code:

D. Disbursements of Funds:

(1) At least two (2) authorized signatures shall be required on any check, draft, warrant or other instrument issued for the disbursement of any accounts, funds or investments held by or in the name of any unit of the Order, or by any corporation, association, partnership or club created or chartered by or under the authority of any unit of the Order.

And a reminder to all, it doesn't matter how small the check amount is, you must have a minimum of two signatures on every check written.



We're going batty in Buckley

The month of August has found most of us holed up in our homes, reluctant to go out and do any more interaction with the world than absolutely necessary. The same is true of a certain group of unwanted residents that has taken up living in the ceiling of the Buckley Odd Fellows Hall. A colony of bats has established itself in

Hall. A colony of bats has established itself in between the ceiling and the roof of the lodge hall and made themselves at home.

The bat infestation was discovered August 1 when a shower of what looked like rat droppings came down from the Grand Lodge office's awning over the sidewalk along Main Street. A pest control expert was called in to investigate. What he found was not rats, but bats — potentially hundreds of bats all roosting in the space above the ceiling in the second floor lodge hall. Because bats are a federally-protected species, special bat-control experts had to come in and review the situation.

The next couple weeks was a flurry of activity as various bat experts came to assess the situation. Estimates ranged from almost \$14,000 to over \$25,000. Once a

contractor to remove the bats was selected, they got right to work. The plan to get rid of the bats included three phases: 1) sealing up most (but not all) of the entrances so the bats could leave but not get back in, 2) setting traps for the remaining bats, and 3) sealing up the remaining entrances once the bats left to ensure they

couldn't return. The timetable for moving from one part of the plan to the next will be determined by the bats and how quickly they all leave.

At this time the lodge is waiting to see how soon all of the bats will leave. Once the bats have left, the contractor will come back in and clean up the bat droppings in

the ceiling. The bats have left quite a mess in our lodge hall and it's not the kind of thing that most lodge members are qualified to clean up (or would want to, for that matter). Once this is all done we should have a clean, fresh, bat-free lodge hall.

Home is COVID-10 free

Odd Fellow Home residents finding ways to visit families via technology

PHASE 1 OUTDOOR VISITS

At the present, the Washington Odd Fellows Home Has no residents or staff members with COVID-19.

Phase I for re-opening long-term care facilities includes a provision for outdoor family visits. The Magnolia Patio area will be open by appointment only. Outdoor visits will be available Monday through Friday from 9 a.m. until noon and 1 p.m. until 3 p.m.

Guests will be screened for symptoms of COVID-19 prior to the visit. There is a limit of 30 minutes per visit subject to weather conditions. The number of visitors is limited to two. Residents are limited to two visits a day.

No more than five people including staff are allowed in a visitation area. Residents on the grounds require masking, social distancing and monitoring by staff.

Assisted Living residents that are in a 14-day quarantine are not eligible for outside visits. Alcohol-based

hand sanitizer will be available upon entering and exiting the visitation areas. Guests must stay in designated visitation locations, such as outdoors on the Magnolia Patio for Assisted Living residents, the Fireside Room for Merriam residents and outdoor courtyard for Clinton residents.

PHASE 1 VIRTUAL OUTDOOR VISITS

Isolation can have a serious effect on the health and well-being of residents in long-term care facilities. At this time visitors are not permitted to enter the Odd Fellows Home buildings or apartments. The risk of catching COVID-19 from a family member, partner or close friend can be controlled by a virtual visit through a microphone attached to a window.

Families are encouraged to communicate with their loved ones via Face Time or Google Duo. Face Time is a

free video program from Apple iPhone or iPad users. GoogleDuo is a free video program for anyone with a Gmail account. Download at the App Store or Play Store. The Activities Staff can help residents with this technology. Contact Maria Muñoz to access a virtual visit.


Food and drinks should be avoided so masks can stay in place. Surfaces are disinfected to prepare for the next conversation. In addition, residents are not allowed to leave the facility with family and then return. To protect tenants from this virus, families can visit via Face Time, GoogleDuo, Walkie Talkie, sign language, cell phone or speaker phone.

Signs reading "Heroes Work Here" are posted on Boyer Avenue and the entrance to the main building. Staff members who protect residents from contact with people who might carry COVID-19 are much appreciated. Remember, take good care of yourself and each other.
