


NORTHWEST HARVEST





Yes, dreams do come true

Walla Walla Wedding Fountain receives generous donation!!!

This report is a compilation of articles from the Walla Walla Union-Bulletin, July 16, 2018; March 25, 2019; August 1, 2019; December 29, 2019; and July 18, 2021.

Do dreams come true? The Wedding Fountain in Walla Walla's Pioneer Park had been silent for 15 years. The system couldn't recycle the water. It had become too costly and inefficient to use. The Ladies' Relief Society donated the fountain in 1910. The Cultus Garden Club restored it in 1984. It was meant to be a place for children to wade and cool off. Over time it was used for weddings, and the name changed to the Wedding Fountain.

PARENTS ENJOYED FOUNTAIN

Shirley Ruble's sister Phyllis Johnson was glancing through a family album and discovered a picture of their Mother and Dad standing beside the fountain in 1931. They married in 1934 and moved to Edison, 60 miles north of Seattle. They raised Shirley, Jim, Jerry, and

Shirley's parents had their wedding photos taken at the fountain in the 1930s. Shirley approached the City of Walla Walla with her idea to request funding. She went to our past State Representative Bill Jenkin (Prosser). Rep. Jenkin submitted a capital budget request to help fund the project and it was accepted.

Phyllis. All have passed away except Shirley and Jim. They remembered their Dad and Mother going to meetings at Edison Odd Fellows Lodge #45, IOOF.

Shirley sent the picture of their parents to her brother Jim who is retired with his wife Barbara in Gig Harbor. Jim said, "Why not ask our daughter Amy to help you apply for funds from the state's capital budget in Olympia?" Amy is a senior advisor to the House of Representatives. She would know what to do.

Representative Bill Jenkin accepted an invitation to sponsor a grant for Andy Coleman, Director of Parks and Recreation in Walla Walla. Coleman requested \$9,000 to complete the repair of the fountain. On March 25, 2019, the full amount was granted! It was the smallest grant made from the 2019-2021 state capital budget.

THE DEDICATION

The invited guests at the Dedication on July 15, 2021, were the Walla Walla City Council, Parks Advisory

Board, State Senator Perry Dozier, Reps. Skyler Rude, and Mark Klicker.

Coleman and Ruble spoke of the good work and completion of the Wedding Fountain by the many partners. With this renovation, the steel fountain was sandblasted and preserved with Electrocoat, a powder coating.

Dax Moreno Construction Company did concrete work including a new base for the fountain. City staff performed plumbing electrical, and landscaping, Now the fountain is lit at night as the lighting was repaired.

The untidy crab apple trees were replaced with dogwood trees. The water flow was changed, too. It originally drained as waste into the sewer system. Now the water is reused through recirculation and is kept on during park hours, from 6 a.m. to 11 p.m. The fountain will get 50 years of new life out of the work, Coleman said.

The project was completed as money came in from several sources. The state donated \$9,000; \$16,000 came from utility bill round-ups; and \$10,000 came from the city, totaling \$35,000.

FAMILY CHERISHED THEIR PARENTS

For Shirley Ruble, the renovation was a heart-felt donation based on a photo of her Mother and Dad standing beside the fountain before they wed. The picture appears in the July 16, 2018 edition of the Union-Bulletin.

Shirley Ruble and a friend went to Pioneer Park to admire the colored lights on the fountain. "We saw three





A LOOK INTO WALLA WALLA'S PAST

In 1902, the Odd Fellows Temple was built on the corner of South Second Avenue and Alder where the Baker Boyer Bank drive-in now stands. It was designed by Walla Walla architect Henry Osterman. Note the sandstone block at the top of the building. The Three Links are incorrectly pointed up. In 1993, when the facade was reassembled in Heritage Park, the Three Links were correctly pointed down. Note From Shirley Ruble: What is wrong with the top picture? As the caption explains, the Three Links should not be pointing up. When the Temple was built in 1902, the links were incorrectly designed. Ninety-one years later in 1993, the Artists' Alliance correctly had the links pointing down. The sandstone was moved to Heritage Park on Main Street where the historic photos may still be seen.

In 1993 the Blue Mountain Art Alliance saved and relocated the facade of the Odd Fellows Building to preserve historic nature of downtown. The sandstone was placed in Heritage Park at 116 East Main Street between Spokane and Colville Streets. A mural was created to honor the civic and ethnic groups in the area between 1850 and 1950. Historic photos were reproduced in porcelain

enamel installed on steel plates.

(Editor's note: About 200 historic Walla Walla photos were given to the Odd Fellows Home in by Joe Drazan in 2006. He is a retired Whitman College archives librarian who collects pictures of the Walla Walla Valley in a blog titled, "Bygone Walla Walla." Shirley Ruble of Narcissa Rebekah Lodge helped with the research.)




