




For a Christmas project Samaritan #52 created "Shoe Box Gifts" for a local nursing care facility. Each member decorated a shoe box size package and



New recordings of Odes available!

Music has long been an essential part of the experience of Odd Fellowship. From the earliest meetings in English pubs, the singing of songs and odes has been an important activity for Odd Fellows.

Eventually the tradition of the members of a lodge singing together became enshrined in our ritual. For many years, lodges could count on having a pianist or organist amongst their ranks to provide live accompaniment for the singing. Now, however, it's increasingly rare that lodges have the luxury of live music.

To address the lack of musicians in lodges, Past Sovereign Grand Musician Toby Hanson has recorded new versions of the Opening and Closing Odes for the Odd Fellows, Rebekahs, and Encampment. Each one of the odes is presented in two forms: one of just piano without singing and one of piano with singing. Toby Hanson played piano on all of the recordings and sang the words for the Odd Fellows and Encampment Odes.

Sister Stacy Thomason of Gold Hill Lodge #129 in Oregon provided the vocals on the Rebekah Opening and Closing Odes.


All of the recordings are available for free use of all lodges of the Independent Order of Odd Fellows. They may be downloaded in AIFF format on the Sovereign Grand Lodge Website at https://odd-fellows.org/member-resources/lodge-odes-and-music/usp=sharing. In the AIFF format the audio files can be burned onto a CD for use in most CD

players. They can also be converted to a compressed format such as MP3 which can be played on many common smart phones and digital audio players.

With these new recordings of the Odes, it is now easier than ever for lodges which have not previous-

ly had the benefit of accompanists to sing. Creating harmony in our lodges by singing the Odes is an essential part of Odd Fellowship and hopefully all lodges will be able to partake in that tradition.

Brother Hanson served as Sovereign Grand Musician from 2019 to 2021 during



the term of Sovereign Grand Master E. Wesley Nelson of Alberta. Toby drew on his quarter century-plus of musical experience as a performer, arranger, and producer to assemble these recordings of the Odes. Previously he had produced new written arrangements of the Odes for piano, organ, guitar, ukulele, and any other 'C' instruments.

We are thankful and proud to be a part of this great and loving Order.



Using social media to promote Lodges

As much of a challenge as the recent pandemic was to the success of Odd Fellowship, it also created some great opportunities to expand our Order. Social media stepped in to fill the space left by restrictions on gatherings. Even though we can start meeting in person again, we can still use social media to promote our lodges and raise their public profile.

FACEBOOK

The easiest way to use social media to promote your lodge is on Facebook. Create a Facebook page for your lodge and then be sure to post regular activity of what your lodge is doing. Having an active presence on Facebook makes it easier to attract new members as they will be more likely to see items on your feed if there are many items to see. Those looking for a lodge to join will be more likely to join one that looks like it's doing things regularly. Make sure you post activities on your page at least once a month to remain timely and relevant. Also be sure to include a lot of pictures. They are a great way of attracting attention on a platform like Facebook.

INSTAGRAM

Another easy way of promoting your lodge is on Instagram. Odd Fellowship is a very visual organization with a lot of beautiful items and symbols which makes it ideal for promoting on Instagram. For those not familiar, Instagram is a photo-sharing app for smart phones. It's free and allows users to post pictures on their feed similar to how they can on Facebook (in fact, both Facebook and Instagram are owned by the same company).

A tech-savvy member of a lodge can sign up for an Instagram account on a smart phone and share pictures of lodge events, regalia, installations, new members, etc. To make the promotion effective, members who share photos should follow other organizations in their community like chambers of commerce, city or county government, schools, other fraternal and community groups, and businesses in the area. When users follow other users they are prompted to "follow back" and subscribe to all of the photos that those other users post. Doing so will create a group of people and organizations who see all of your lodge's posts on Instagram.

HASHTAGS

A big part of the power of Instagram is hashtags. They allow users to categorize and identify their content. Hashtags begin with the pound sign (#) and have a short word or phrase to describe the picture. There are already some well-known hashtags in use for pictures from Odd Fellows: #ioof, #flt, #threelinks, #oddfellow, #oddfellows, and #oddfellowship.

Using the hashtags is easy. After writing a short description for the photo, add one or more of the hashtags to the end of the description so that users searching for Odd Fellows pictures will be able to find yours. This also works well for our Rebekah Sisters as they have their own Instagram hashtag: #iamarebekah.

DISCORD

Although not specifically for promoting your lodge, another effective social media tool for Odd Fellows is Discord. Discord is a chat server which allows groups of people to post messages to the group in real time. Other people on the group can then read those messages. With the recent influx of younger, more tech-experienced members in the Odd Fellows, a special Discord server has been set up especially for Odd Fellows.

The server is named "Heart In Hand Online" and is open to Odd Fellows in good standing from all around the world. To this point it's mostly members in North America that have joined but there are members from the Philippines, Cuba, and a few European Jurisdictions. Having a Discord server dedicated to Odd Fellowship allows us to converse in real time about Odd Fellowship and allows for the exchange of ideas, particularly about what is helping lodges around the country to grow.

Washington has the second highest number of members on Discord after California. Members who are interested in joining the Odd Fellows Discord server can do so at https://oddfellowsprimer.wordpress.com/heart-in-hand-online/. A link to the server and instructions are available on that website.

YES, THE TIMES ARE CHANGING

In earlier days, promoting a lodge was easy. Lodges had buildings right in the middle of their town or neighborhood and those buildings usually had bright, eyecatching signs out front to let the community know that the Odd Fellows and Rebekahs met there. We also used to take part in community events and activities, from parades to pie auctions to town festivals. Now, however, much civic life happens through social media and if we expect people to know who we are and be able to find our lodges to join, we have to engage them where they are. That means lodges and members have to have a social media presence.

Hopefully the resources shared in this article will make it easy for lodges to reach out and let their communities know about their existence. After all, there's no one else who is going to promote your lodge for you. Letting your community know you exist is only going to happen if you do it.

Members of Yakima IOOF Lodge #22 voted to serve her by upgrading her bathroom so that she will have a walkin shower. This will be a *HUGE* safety change for her. She uses a walker for short distances and a wheelchair for appointments. What a great blessing it will be for Kathy to have this change in her home. Thankfully, a Yakima #22 Odd Fellow who is a plumber is in charge of the work.


