

Once again a reminder that it's important to keep the Grand Secretary, Grand Scribe, Rebekah Assembly Secretary, GLEA Scribes, Lodge Secretaries and Encampment Scribes notified when you move or have some type of change of address.

LET'S TALK ABOUT RETENTION

I took the opportunity to read through some of the past issues of our newspaper to get some idea of

what the Grand Warden's articles should contain. To no great surprise they generally revolved around MEMBERSHIP! Thousands of words have been written by my predecessors on the subject of recruiting new members into our Order. I noticed, however, that fewer words were written regarding RETENTION. How do you retain members, especially the newer Brothers and Sisters? One

One of the great things about our Order is that a member can be

word — *INVOLVEMENT*.

as involved as one wishes. We all know members who have been with the order 10, 20, 30 or more years and are always there when there is a project to be done or parade or event in which to participate. These folks are the rock upon which our Order is built. But what about our newer Brothers and Sisters?

IT CAN BE OVERWHELMING

New members (and I know this from experience)

can often feel a bit overwhelmed by the conduct of a meeting as the Officers perform the Rituals. There are a number of appointed positions a new member can fill that minimally involves them in the Ritual, but allows them to **OBSERVE** and **LEARN** many of the finer points.

KEEP YOUR MEMBERS HAPPY

Many is the time I've asked a newer member to take a position and they ask, "What if I make a mistake?" I assure them that if that happens they will undoubtedly be the very first to ever do so.

Introduce them to the duties of the officers, lead them, mentor them, teach them, but remember that not everyone aspires to be Sovereign Grand Master. Everyone will find the level of involvement with which they are comfortable. Comfortable members are happy members; happy members remain members who, in turn, recruit new members who are taught and led and mentored and become comfortable and happy who then recruit new members. . . and the cycle continues.

So far I've written about recruiting and retaining. In keeping with the "3Rs" motif perhaps my next article should be about recognition. Until then. . .



In the past two years Odd Fellowship made a significant advance into the future with the launch of multiple podcasts dedicated to Odd Fellowship. Chief among these is the *Three Links Odd Cast*, hosted by Past Sovereign Grand Musician Toby Hanson, SGL Webmaster Ainslie Heilich, and Grand Secretary of West Virginia Mike Duminiak.

In the first two years the podcast has featured discussions of various topics of interest to Odd Fellows including history, origins, traditions, operations, and more. Some of the highlights of the first two seasons of the podcast have included discussions about efforts to rehabilitate the Odd Fellows' Rest cemetery in New Orleans, multiple interviews with members who have chartered new lodges, an episode about an Odd Fellows' banner rediscovered under the floorboards of a building in Australia, crossover specials with other podcasts that have discussed Odd Fellowship, an instructional episode outlining the proper procedures for running a lodge meeting, and an assortment of episodes talking to new members about their experiences.

As the *Three Links Odd Cast* moves into its third year, it has several accomplishments. There have been almost 14,000 downloads across the world with 20 per cent of those coming from outside North America, from every continent except Antarctica. Listeners in eight Canadian provinces and 49 states (all except Delaware) have downloaded and listened to the podcast.

More importantly, listeners report having joined lodges as a result of finding and listening to the podcast. The *Three Links Odd Cast* has been an important way of sharing news in Odd Fellowship including the formation of new lodges and the revitalization of older ones.




