
Seven lodges combine for 'Super Installation' at Olympia IOOF #1



Past Grand Master Hugh **Alexander Smith** passed away on December 22, 2022 just a week short of his 94th birthday. He was born on December 28. 1928. He served as Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Washington in 1999-2000,

Brother Hugh A. Smith was initiated an Odd Fellow in Titusville Lodge #34, of Kent on October 14, 1965. Bellingham Bay Lodge #31 and was elected an Associate Member of Titusville on February 8, 2001. Brother Hugh transferred his regular membership back to Titusville Lodge #34 on March 11, 2004.

He became a Past Grand of Titusville Lodge #34 on December 31, 1970. He also served as Noble Grand for his Associate Lodge, Monroe Lodge #156 in 2017, 18, 19, and 20.

Brother Hugh was commissioned to and served several terms as District Deputy Grand Master for many Grand Masters. Hugh loved the Odd Fellow degree work and was known to check out the Grand Lodge's video ritual (VHS) tape to help under populated lodges in his district confer a better degree.

Brother Hugh served our Order as Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Washington in 1999-2000. His program was as follows:




