



Fort Casey outing was a beautiful day!


We can't believe it's almost time for Theta Rho Assembly. We are busy getting ready for Sessions and looking forward to lots of good times with the other clubs.

Hope Rebekahs host a formal tea party!!


On May 15 Hope Rebekah #38 in Spokane held a formal tea party — "Hi Tea."




