

I hope everyone had a good Thanksgiving.

ANNUAL REPORTS

Odd Fellow Secretaries, your Annual Reports have been mailed out. Be sure to get these back on time. Once again this is two weeks earlier so you should have plenty of time to get the forms filled out. Make sure to double check for signatures, seals, and that the financial form balances. If you need any assistance at all, please do not hesitate to contact me at the Grand Lodge of Washington office.

TRAVELING PASSWORD

I've included the new password for 2025 in your packet as the Sovereign Grand Lodge has gotten me the Annual Traveling Password early. The password is *not* to be given out until the first meeting after your lodge has its installation of officers.

INSTALLATION OF OFFICERS

It's now December and you should be preparing for your Installation of Officers in January. DDGM's are responsible to make sure this happens, but your lodge can request the Grand Lodge officers to install your new officers. Please contact me if that is what your lodge wishes and I'll get it on the installation spreadsheet.

ELECTIONS FOR REPRESENTATIVE

I know it's early, but start thinking about your Lodge Representative for 2025. Elections for a two-year Representative must be held during the first meeting in February of 2025. All ODD NUM-BERED lodges will need to elect a Representative. Try to make sure that your Representative can attend Grand Lodge in June. They MUST BE A PAST GRAND — no exceptions. A letter and certificates will be going out in January. Do not elect your Representative until the first meeting in February.

LODGE CARDS

The Lodge Card section in *The Washington OddFellow* is where your lodge can have the Noble Grand and Secretary listed for contact purposes, when your lodge meets, time, etc. Payment is due in February. If your lodge has not done this, please cut out or copy the form and mail it back with two signatures:-). If your lodge already does this there is an expiration date at the bottom. If it says the expiration is 2/28/2025, then it's time to get your renewal in. If I do not have the form and payment by the 15th of February, your Lodge Card will be removed. You can usually find the Lodge Card listings in the center of the newspaper on pages 8 and 9.

With the New Year just around the corner, we encourage all Lodges to take a moment and send us articles about your lodge and any pictures. 


