


Please check your Lodge Card for expiration date

Annual Reports Due February 15

Secretaries, just a reminder: Lodge Annual Reports are due next month by February 15. That means into my office by that date. Plan ahead and make sure that you mail the report in plenty of time. Make sure all pages are signed, sealed, balanced, and all pages are returned. The pages are numbered and that should make it easier. Do not email them. They must be mailed. For each day the report is not in after the 15th of February, your lodge will be charged \$5 as per *Washington Digest* (black book).

"3.20.4. Failure To Make Returns. If a Lodge should fail to make its returns for the preceding year as required by the two preceding sections, by the date of February 15th of each new year, the offending lodge shall be fined no more than five dollars (\$5.00) per day for each day after that date and any lodge failing to submit a report by April 1st, shall be denied a seat in this Grand Lodge."




Gifts from Oak Leaf to Acorn
