

'24 SGL updates to the **Code of General Laws**

Brothers and Sisters.

The Sovereign Grand Lodge Code updates were mailed out December 26. Your Lodge Secretaries should have received them by now and your books should have been updated. If not they should be updated as soon as possible.

On another note, here are a couple of updates that, if you haven't read the Code, you should be aware of. Some of the important updates that were voted on last August at the SGL sessions are:

"Chapter IV Sec. 8, page IV-13 D. Duties of the Grand Secretary. (2) information (a)(iv) The full name, date of birth, current mailing address, physical address of residence, telephone number, and email address of each member whether regular, associate, or non-contributing. Said information is to include the member's status of membership." Which means, Unit Secretaries, Scribes, Clerks need to make sure that all of the member's information is provided. Once again, please use the SGL new member information sheets. Do not use the yellow or blue cards. These are outdated and do not provide all of the information needed.


Evan Ochs initiated into Buckley IOOF Lodge #75


BUCKLEY WELCOMES EVAN OCHS

Chapter V Sec. 13 Odd Fellow Lodges V-7 D. Financial Secretary

"Dropping a member for non-payment of dues is illegal if the member was not notified in writing of their arrearages and a proper record of the notice was not made in the minutes of the Unit. A member may not be dropped for non-payment of dues until a period of one hundred twenty (120) days has lapsed after said member became in arrears for an amount equal to one (1) year's dues." So, here's a rule of thumb. If your lodge requires dues to be paid by the first of the year, and a member doesn't comply, then send out the dues envelope with the information on the inside stating that dues for the year are \$\$. If you do not receive dues by say August, then send them the delinquent notice which is in the Washington Digest (black book) under forms on page 152, Form No. 4. Then if they still have not paid by November send them Form No. 5 Statement — Final Notice on page 153. Then after the 120 days, which if on a calendar year would be May 1st, you can drop them for non-payment. You will need to send Form No. 6 Termination which is on page 154. And be sure to enclose a membership application. Your lodge will still be responsible for per capita dues on these members because they will still be listed on your previous year's report.

And this also goes for all units and junior branches of the Order.

Here's some good news. "Chapter VI I.A.R.A Article VI. Members

Sec. 2. Who may attend. Any Rebekah in good standing." You do not have to be a Past Noble Grand or have the Rebekah Assembly Degree to attend IARA Sessions. You just have to be a Rebekah in good standing."

"Chapter XIII General Military Council Article IV.

Members Sec. 1 The working members of the General Military Council with voting powers are: Department Commanders or their accredited representative, Past Department Commanders and Past Presidents of the Department Association.

A. It is to be understood that a Department Council may be represented by the Department Commander or a Representative (either or / but not both. See GMC By-laws for additional allowance for Representatives, Article VI, Section 4.)."

"Chapter XXIV Funds, Fees, Income, Dues, Assessments, Benefits

Sec. 1 General C. Component Bodies. (2) Dues (d.) Dues commence on the date the person signs the Membership Register or when reinstated. Dues from that date may be pro-rated through the Unit year and accrue thereafter. No unit has the right to refuse any dues tendered."

"Chapter XXVIII Emblems, Regalia, Jewels, Etc. And their use.

Sec. 3 Jewels B. Veteran Jewels (1) Odd Fellows Veteran Jewel. (c) Members who have previously held membership in a Theta Rho Girls' Club may count years of service towards an Odd Fellows Veteran Jewel."



- \$4,000 Degree Program Nursing Scholarship (Endowed by the Grand Lodge of lowa)

 For students pursing an accredited nursing program in an associate, baccalaureate, masters or other degree program nursing related field.
- \$1,000 LPN & CNA Nursing Certificate Scholarship (Endowed by the Grand Lodge of lowa) For students pursing an accredited nursing program in an LPN or CNA certificate program.
- 2,000 Vocational Technology Scholarship
 For students enrolled in a Vocational or Technology
 Institution training for quality job skills in a particular job function or trade.
 - \$2,000 Wirz Scholarship

For students in a regular college curriculum who may not be an Odd Fellow or Rebekah member or related to an Odd Fellow of Rebekah member.

• \$3,500 Peter Geolot Continuing Education Grants

For members who wish to enroll in continuing education courses in their job related field, or for enrollment in continuing education courses in a new field to further their occupational goals.

• \$16,000 Student Loans

Loans for students in a full academic course of four or more years bearing an interest rate of 4%.

Repayments begin three months after graduation or discontinuing college.


