Recently I've had several people ask my opinion of the Odd Fellows Ritual. There's a short answer and a longer answer. We'll start with the short.

SHORT ANSWER

Open your Charge Book and turn to page "iv" just past the table of contents. The last sentence of the last paragraph states that no other (Ritual) shall be used.

LONGER ANSWER

Our Ritual defines who we are and differentiates us from other, similar organizations. Periodically Sovereign Grand Lodge will make revisions to the Ritual during Annual Sessions and publish those changes. The most recent revision was in 2005. Those who have read the

entire Charge Book have likely noticed some, for lack of a better word, archaic language; and most notably in the Degree Work. This language is, to me, part of the charm of our Ritual; it connects the present members with those who founded our organiza-

tion and provides a link for our future members through us to those founders.

Each meeting, each conduct of the Ritual should be a celebration of Odd Fellowship: Opening according to the Ritual, conducting business, and closing according to the Ritual.

In my opinion should a lodge have something that doesn't strictly fall within the Ritual but has become a part of their identity as a Lodge, is why there is a portion of the Order of Business called "Good of the Order."

Good of the Order may encompass many things that are not a part of the Ritual such as announcements of upcoming events within or outside the Order, a sharing time where simple casual discussion is held (remember, religion and politics stay outside). Upon completion of Good of the Order then the meeting is ritualistically and formally closed.

As I said earlier, our Ritual is what defines us as Odd Fellows. Celebrate and enjoy who we are!



Sherry Daneen Brickey Pond, Grand Patriarch of the Grand Encampment of Washington for 2009-2010, and Grand Matriarch of the Grand LEA in 2018-2019 passed away on January 4, 2025. She was 84.

During her time in our Order, Sister Sherry was a member of: Three Link Rebekah Lodge #92, Beacon Rebekah Lodge #91, Hope Rebekah Lodge #38, Hillyard Rebekah Lodge #145, Golden Rule Rebekah Lodge #242, and Eureka State Lodge #S1

She also belonged to: Spokane LAPM#2, joining on November 13, 2000; Unique Unified Encampment #32 joining on September 23, 1997 (she was actually a member of the LEA prior to 2000 as women were not allowed membership until then); Tri-City LEA #66; Samaritan Odd Fellows Lodge #52, joining October 1, 2002; and Pasco Odd

Sister Sherry was a Grand High Priestess and Past President of the LAPM Association, as well as PNG of the Rebekahs.
