From the desk of your Grand Master



The Final Chapter

Somehow the article I wrote for the April issue was reprinted in the May issue. So, this article is being edited a bit to make it my final article as Grand Master.

I just returned from the Pilgrimage to the Tomb where I was honored to lay a wreath at the Tomb of the Unknowns in Arlington National Cemetery. It was an emotional event for me, but I managed to hold it all together....mostly.

In my visitations, to date, I have had the opportunity to renew and make new acquaintances, have many valuable discussions on many matters both Odd Fellow related and otherwise.

I was asked at one lodge if I thought that being Grand Master had changed me. After some reflection I have to say yes, it changed me in that I have worn a suit and tie more in the past 10 months that I have in the past ten years; other than that, I hope not.

As is my final article as Grand Master I'm going to share some impressions and observations.

I was somewhat concerned at the lodges that could not make quorum for a meeting; while on the other hand I was heartened by the appearance of new, and notably, younger faces at some lodges. Discussions usually centered around recruiting, retention, participation and following the ritual. Community service was also discussed. As each community is unique each lodge seems to take a unique approach to serving those communities. Scholarships are the most common form of community support, but the

lodges also sponsor and participate in seasonal events, local festivals and parades to illustrate the lodge's commitment to improving their community. And here is where the new members can bring in fresh ideas, perspectives and innovations. Often the subject of Schools of Instruction surfaced; taking some time during good of the order and working on just one small, and often, lesser used part of the ritual such as balloting.

While my visitations have all been enjoyable and informative the most enjoyable part was always talking with the newest members of our order. Their questions and thirst for knowledge regarding Odd Fellowship were invigorating and welcomed. I especially liked impressing upon them to seek out positions of leadership within their lodge. Many expressed concerns at making mistakes in the ritual and I assured them all that if they made a mistake that they would be the only person in 206 years to have ever made one; and that there was nothing to prevent them from serving as Noble Grand, Grand Master or even Sovereign Grand Master.

There are still so many places to go, things to do and people to see I'm not sure I will be able to accomplish everything I set out to do but I will keep working.

I was recently asked if I was looking forward to my term being over. That's a very difficult question to answer. I've been in a number of positions, over the years, that were very enjoyable and rewarding and I was saddened to see them come to an end. Add being Grand Master to that list. It's not an easy job, no worthwhile job is, but it is rewarding in ways that cannot be simply expressed. Would I do it again? Without a doubt.

Every day that the Sun comes up is a GREAT day to be an Odd Fellow.


I hope you all have a wonderful summer. Be watching for activities such as the Heads of the Order Reception, and Olympia #1's Anniversary and Seafood Dinner.






