There were no changes in the Grand Encampment Digest this year. Let me know if your Encampment needs a Digest.


If your Encampment has by-law amendments, please send them to the Grand Patriarch for approval. Yes, we're different then the Grand Lodge.

## Grand Patriarch asks: 'What is Patriarchy?'

Most non-Odd folks, on hearing about a patriarchal fraternity, might imagine a group of incels meeting in a basement to swap misogynist jokes. The implications of "militant patriarchy" are simply frightening in this age of random ideological violence. So I'd like to look at the history of this word and clarify precisely why we uphold it as an ideal of virtuous conduct and a pragmatic program for enlightened society.

In sociological use from the 19th century, patriarchy referred to autocratic rule by the male head of a family. In the 20th century, this was largely superseded by the feminist usage of "patriarchy" as the male domination of society and the systemic subjugation of women. At the present moment, any other use seems archaic.

Yet the etymology of the word tells a somewhat different story. "Patriarchy" derives not from "pater" (father, as in "paternity"), but from "patria" (family, lineage, tribe, as in "patriotism"). In the Jewish tradition (from which the Christian and Muslim traditions spring) the "patriarchal age" refers to the time of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob (or more broadly from Adam to Abraham). This was an age when the basic social unit was the clan or tribe. As Odd Fellows, we have formed a family or tribe based not on the unchosen destiny of blood, but on conscious choice. We are literally a "chosen people". One of the attractive aspects of Jewish tribal society as reflected in the Torah is the consciousness of social life as a network of agreements (covenants, or contracts) founded on personal honor. This is fundamental to Odd Fellowship, as reflected in the vow of Friendship in the 1st Degree.

Of course, we are talking about myth not history. Much like other fraternal models (the Order of Red Men, the Shriners, the Muscovites, etc.) we are using a sort of fairy tale reflection of other times and places to focus our inquiries into present day problems. We aren't holding up animal sacrifice, polygamy, or slavery as values. Rather we are positing a set of universal values that operate across time and space. These values undergird our practical morality, the way that we treat people face to face and day to day.

It's worth remembering that the original meaning of "virtue" is "power." The virtues of generosity, hospitality, and sacrifice are powers that we wield in an ongoing struggle against the dark powers of greed, narrow-mindedness, and intolerance. It is the particular virtue of patriarchal Odd Fellowship that our understanding of our fraternal duty inherent to the lodge is extended to the entire world and to all of humanity.
