





Washington members participate in Cave Degree

During the weekend of September 5-7, Grand Chaplain Penny Curtis and Grand Musician (and PGM) Toby Hanson, traveled to Yreka, California to participate in the Cave Degree Weekend. The Cave Degree began as a presentation of the Second Degree by Yreka Lodge #19 in the Pythian Cave near Mount Shasta in 1940. In 1962, the Yreka Lodge bought the cave and surrounding property from the Knights of Pythias, bringing it fully under the control of the lodge.

Originally, the Cave Degree was just a presentation of the Second Degree, or Degree of Brotherly Love, in the cave facing Mount Shasta, given by the light of the moon. A rudimentary stage had been constructed for use by the Degree Team to exemplify the Degree. As it became more popular, the Cave Degree expanded into a full weekend, with the First Degree added to the weekend, then the Initiatory, and eventually the Third Degree. The highlight remained the moonlit presentation of the Second Degree.

Prior to the COVID-19 Pandemic, the last Cave Degree was in 2019. After that event the stage and approach stairs were deemed to be in dangerous condition. Yreka Lodge turned the cave and surrounding property over to the Grand Lodge of California. A fundraising drive was initiated to make the much-needed improvements to bring the cave up to safe, modern standards. Work began during the pandemic and finished up in time for the Cave Degree to return in 2024 with two weekends and expanded Degree presentations including the Patriarchal Degree.

For 2025, the Cave Degree Weekend was further enlarged to include an English Country Dance on Friday night, for which Grand Musician Hanson and Ashley Hill of Davis Lodge #169 provided the music on fiddle and accordion;


