

Odd Fellows arrived at their home and delivered a full turkey dinner and presents for each of the children and the mother, too. After the Christmas feast, the family was invited to a holiday party with a bubble gum blowing contest for the children. Little Linda won the contest and the prize was the exact same doll the lodge had given her as a gift the day before. This second doll thrilled Linda to no end because she now had twins! The acts of generosity by that lodge were remembered fondly down through the years by the entire family.

Fast Forward To 2025

In the present day, 2025, another person was in need. This time it was Nora, the eldest daughter of Linda, who had been the recipient of such kindness and generosity from the Odd Fellows as a child. Facing a crisis of her own, Nora was needing to find a new home. With the expenses of housing in this day and age, coming up with the money to move into a new rental was daunting for someone of such modest means as Nora. Again, almost like a miracle, an Odd Fellow found out about her need and brought it to his lodge. Just as before, the lodge stepped up to show compassion on those in their community and donated the necessary funds to help Nora secure a new place to live.


Tom and Kendra Frogge' were back at Encampment after a lengthy illness. We are so glad Tom is doing better and they were both able to attend the meeting.



The Encampment Rituals take place in an ahistorical land dominated by warrior pastoralists. What are the virtues that we project on this strange land, so completely unlike our own in so many ways? And how do we see ourselves in this distant mirror?

For one thing, the Rituals evoke a nostalgia for a simpler life of authenticity and sincerity. The Patriarchy presents as a model of self-sufficient society based on humaneness and consensual custom. None of us are old enough to have grown up without the overriding presence of mass media. It is even more difficult to imagine a time before photography or audio recording, when our only collective memory was built from direct personal experience or someone else's account of their experience.

These days, the context of our lives seems less determined by local mores or the network of our personal relationships than imposed from above by some distant collective authority. The Rituals, on the other hand, posit a world where individuals and their decisions have meaning. They take the stand that we can remake the world we live in to reflect universal values of humanity.

The Patriarchs are exemplars of strength, wisdom, and generosity. Their strength comes from their integrity; their wisdom comes from their submission to God (or Reality, if you like); and their generosity comes from their understanding of our fraternal connection with all beings.

While each individual's conscience is respected, this model of building a healthy, sustainable world is not centered on individual survival but on the tribe. The tribe is the functional unit that must be served and protected. The tribe, like the lodge, has an inside and an outside. This distinction has meaning because of the commitment of those on the inside to work together to build a better world on the foundation of shared belief. The

commitment to those within the group is primary and necessary, but it fails utterly if the relationship with those outside the tribe is not one of respect and hospitality. Then it becomes simply another version of selfishness. There may be guards at the door, but it is always open.

Revelation And Inspiration

The Patriarchs also represent a direct embodiment of revelation and inspiration. We see in the example of Abraham when he is tested by God, or of Aram when God comes to him in a dream after he ejects the fire-worshiper from his tent, that the voice of wisdom speaks directly to the individual conscience. This is a prophetic model, where no one stands between the Absolute and the human heart.

But even here, in some sense, the community trumps the individual. Since everyone has to work out their own negotiation with Reality, and we are enjoined to respect this process in others (the whole point of the Golden Rule Degree), the prophetic function becomes democratized. We have to struggle to find harmony as we work together, understanding that the voice of Truth is coming through everyone at once, no matter how distorted it may seem to us at the time. Our individual journey towards clarity only becomes genuinely meaningful in the action of service to a greater cause.

The Patriarchs of our Rituals, while serving as projections of our own ideals, are at the same time the reflections of the actual men and women throughout history who have embodied a spirit of sacrifice, tolerance, and assistance. They are our ancestors, and we inherit both the fruit of their efforts and their responsibilities.

I have been volunteering at the Food Bank and have seen a big demand.


