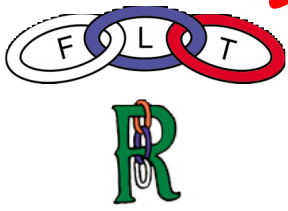

## Ellensburg #20 sends 9 delegates to Pilgrimage

On Sunday, January 11, Ellensburg Odd Fellows Lodge #20 proudly hosted a packed house for this year's IOOF Pilgrimage For Youth (PFY) Speech Luncheon, where 84 community members gathered in support of nine remarkable high school students from Ellensburg, Cle Elum-Roslyn, and Wahluke High Schools competing for a spot on this prestigious civic journey.

Following weeks of preparation, including writing essays, gathering letters of support, and speech mentoring sessions, the finalists delivered powerful speeches centered on the social issues they care most about. Topics ranged from mental health to AI to social media use to healthcare to censorship and climate change. Each student brought not only their voice but their vision for a stronger community.

- Remind your Noble Grand of any unfinished business that will need to be addressed.
- Come to each meeting with your minute book ready to read the roll of Officers – please read their office and complete name.
- Pre-read all correspondence and bills before the meeting. This helps you present them in a professional manner during your lodge meeting.
- At the end of each meeting, be sure your financial information matches that of your Treasurer. Please don't discuss finances (or anything else) during the meeting. This is disruptive as well as disrespectful to your Noble Grand. Go over the bills and basic finances prior to the meeting and, if necessary, stay after the meeting to straighten things out.
- Take notes as accurately as possible and be sure to review your minutes the next day, while the meeting is still fresh in your mind, so you can clarify the parts that you may have hurried through. Keeping clear and complete records is vital not only for historical purposes, but to help you work with your Noble Grand in running a smooth, productive meeting.
- Read through your minutes prior to next meeting to be familiar with what you recorded.


Well, this is a lot of information. I'm sure it is not new to any of you, but sometimes we all need to be reminded of the basics. I am blessed to work with many wonderful Secretaries in our lodges. I learn a lot from each of you and really appreciate it when you share ideas with me.

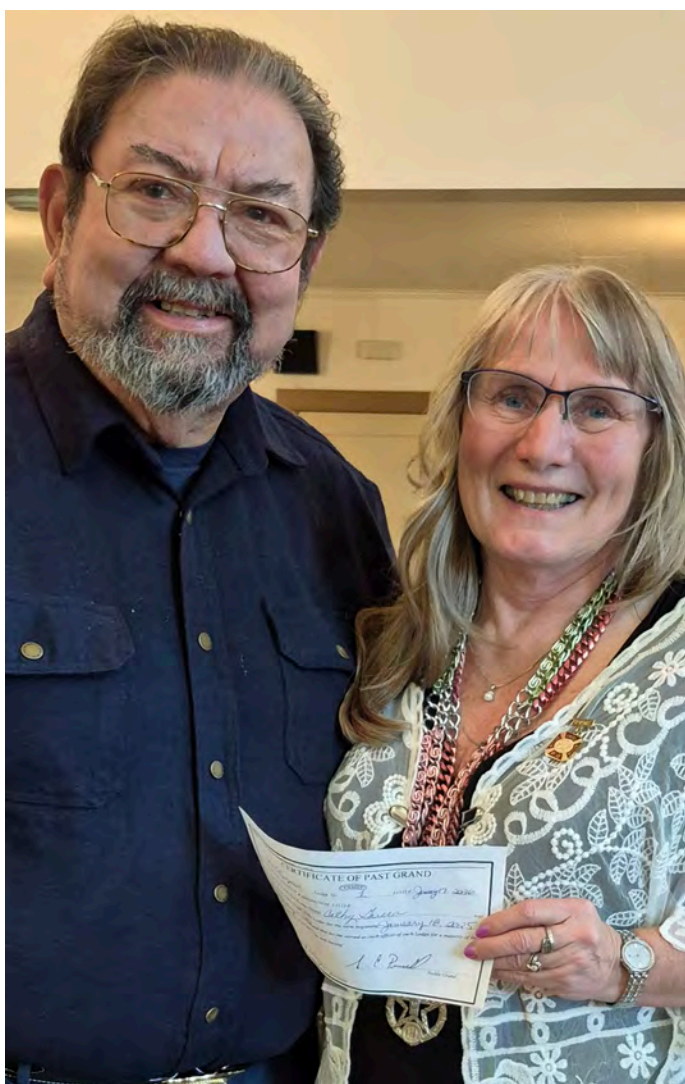

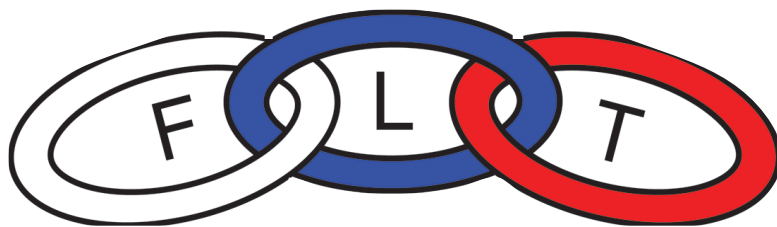
